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Team Alignment


Urgent and most important problem to be addressed first

- <u>Case Study 1: Communication gap</u> within the team (inefficiencies in communication, lack of clarity on workstreams, unclear effective communication mode) – best practices...
- Case Study 2: How to have a healthy debate or get doubts solved?
- <u>Case Study 3:</u> Team thinks you are not working (because you are not virtually visible)
- Case Study 4: Top down communication challenges
- <u>Case Study 5:</u> Whatsapp is the dominant strategy (groups / personal messages)
- Case Study 6: What are your office hours? Lack of demarcation
- <u>Case Study 7:</u> What to do when seniors suddenly become unavailable?
- Case Study 8: Working with different managers & their priority expectations

Drafting effective emails to convey the message

Think of it like an executive summary

How to start working on the presentation?

Build a WIP version on an easy to change and alter medium:

- Option 1 Word Doc on the story with headline and key points
- Option 2 PPT with only headings or storyline (content page)
- Option 3 Draw slides on papers
- Option 4 List key findings on a sticky note & connect them to build a story



Priceless yet hard to follow tip:

- 15 minutes to reduce
- 15 minutes to think about : Narrative, Elevator pitch, 'SO WHAT', follow up!

How to make a visually appealing & understandable presentation


Three very simple tips to remember

- Logical flow [overall + on each slide] (use markers & arrows generously)
- 2. One message on one slide (Avoid clutter & prefer blankspace)
- 3. Utilize visuals, but don't overdo (use colours sparingly)
- 4. In case of team work consistency in look & feel
- 5. Flow charts make your life easier

Critical tip: Don't forget to give references wherever used

Becoming a good story teller!

- Story should flow fluidly
- Emotions, Conflicts, Solution, Crisis
- So what?? key question
- How you execute versus how you present
- Audience is the king
- Compelling story
- Key takeaway
- Points McKinsey way of three!



Finally, the presentation ...

GENERAL ADVICE

- Set up your Virtual Stage well in advance
 - Microphone
 - Background
 - Face angle
 - Lighting
 - Platform & presentation (try & test)
- Be cautious about your voice pace and clarity, Internet can backfire at times
- Respond to the Audience's body language [Conduct engagement activities, but do not force-fit]

PERSONAL LEARNINGS

- Point the cursor to denote
- Verbally saw left part of the slide, right part, bottom left etc – instead of saying here and there
- Say slide number, in excel saw worksheet named XXX and cell number/ row/ column XXX
- Set time for Q&A
- Practice, practice, practice

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Interview Tips

Preparation remains the same, delivery changes

PREP BEFORE INTERVIEW BEGINS

- Do a dry run
- Remember it's a great opportunity better than in-person interview
- Clothing all rules applicable
- Get familiar with the platform
- Avoid distractions in front of you (for yourself) and behind you (for interviewer)
- Kids will be kids!
- Practice with a friend or coaching buddy

PERSONAL LEARNINGS

- Login atleast 20 minutes before (NOT ALWAYS check if it's a shared link?)
- Double check date, time and timezone
- Show your real background (if it's suitable)
- Engage the interviewer with eye contact and connection
- Watch the recording of your mock interviews
- Tell everyone in your house that its your interview
- Watch your expressions everything is zoomed in

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Body Language

Basics need to be right even in a virtual set-up

- Plain wall/ books pay importance to background
- Right angle of face & screen
- Good window lighting natural / artificial
- DON'T USE PHONES
- LOOK AT THE CAMERA
- Don't lean in, maintain appropriate distance
- Formal attire denotes sincerity



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Building Relationships

You might find some of the best set of people at your workplace

- Empathy towards team members
- Basic courtesy good time to talk? Please, sorry, thank you
- Attitude and approachability of other person
- Clear communication of your preferred mode of communication ask the opposite person the same
- Set aside time to just catch-up
- Virtual 10-15 min Coffee Sessions with peers & immediate juniors + seniors
- Help junior articles !!
