- Official Secrets Act, 1923 [S.22]
- Enacted on 15 June 2005. Came into force on 12 October 2005.
- The Act contains 6 chapters and 31 sections with 2 schedules



Methodology

- Identify the public authority which holds the information
- Identify who to submit application to within the public authority
- Draft a clearly focused application maximum500 words
- Submit your application 26/04/2013



Obtaining Information

- 1. Receive request
- 2. Payment of fee
- 3. SPIO solicit assistance
- 4. Provide information



Stipulated Time

- □ 48 hours [S. 7(1)]
- □ 30 days [S. 7(1)]
- 35 days [S. 5(2)]
- 40 days [S. 11(3)]
- Failure to provide information in stipulated time is deemed refusal [S. 7(2)]

- Determination of fee
- Below poverty line [S. 7(5)]
- Additional fee to be paid
- Fee when response is delayed [s. 7(6)]
- Mode of Payment of fee Cash, DD, PO, Court Fee Stamp, Non Judical Stamp, Treasury Challan,



Definition of 'Information' [S.2(f)

"information" means any material in any form, including

- Records

Memos

Samples

- info related

Documents

Opinions

Models

to any private body

Press Releases

Advices

Emails

- Circulars

Orders

Data in

Log Books

Contracts

electronic

form

Papers



Definition of 'Record' [S. 2(i)]

"record" includes

- a) any document, manuscript and file
- any microfilm, microfiche and facsimile copy of a document
- c) any reproduction of image or images embodied in such microfilm (whether enlarged or not)
- d) any other material produced by a computer or any other device



Definition of 'Right' [S. 2(j)]

- "right to information" includes the right to
- i. inspection of work, documents, records
- ii. taking notes, extracts or certified copies of documents or records
- v. certified samples of material
- vi. diskettes, floppies, tapes, video cassettes or in any other electronic mode or through printouts where such information is stored in a computer or in any other device



Obligations of Public Authorities

[S.4]

- Catalogue, index and computerised records [S. 4(1)]
- 2. Publish within 120 days (Oct 12)
 - Particulars of organisation, powers and functions of officers and employees, rules regulations, instructions, manuals

Obligations of Public Authorities



- Categories of documents
- Budget
- Subsidy programs
- Designate State Public Information Officers
- Constant Endeavour to provide information suo moto



Third Party Information

Other public authority [S. 6(3)]

 Any other entity owned, controlled, or substantially financed by government [S. 11(1)]

Any other private entity with its permission



Exemptions [S. 8]

- a) affects the sovereignty and integrity of India
- b) forbidden by any court of law or tribunal
- c) breach of privilege of Parliament or the State Legislature
- d) information related to agencies mentioned in the Second Schedule of the Act



Exemptions....

- e) Commercial confidence, trade secrets or intellectual property
- f) Information from a foreign government
- g) Cabinet papers including records of deliberations of the Council of Ministers, Secretaries or prosecution of offenders
- h) Information which relates to personal matters, the disclosure of which has no bearing on any public activity or interest



Partial Information [S. 10]

Partial information shall be given along with

- a) The reasons for the decision
- b) The name and designation of the person giving the decision
- c) Details of the fees calculated
- d) Right of the petitioner w.r.t. review of the decision



Rejection [S. 7(8)]

- 1. The reasons for such a rejection
- 2. The period within which an appeal against such a rejection may be preferred
- The particulars of the appellate authority




State Information Commission

- First Appeal [S. 19(1)]
 - ✓ With the officer senior in rank to the State Public Information Officer

- ☐ Second Appeal [S. 19(3)]
 - ✓ With the State Information Commission



Reasons for Appeal [S. 18(1)]

- No Information officer available
- Request refused
- 3. No response from the officer
- Unreasonable fee charged
- 5. Incomplete, misleading or false information
- 6. Incorrect information produced



Powers of State Information Commission

- Burden of proof on the IO [S. 20 (1)]
- ☐ Fine [S. 20(1)]
- Disciplinary action [S. 20(2)]

Penalty Provisions (S20)

Penalty of Rs.250 per day up to maximum Rs.25,000 for:

- Not accepting the application
- Delaying information release without reasonable causes
- Malafidely denying information
- Knowingly giving incomplete, incorrect, misleading information
- Destroying information that is requested

Some recent Issues

- Yale University study on RTI at Delhi slum for ration card issue.
- Previous CIC Mr. Shailesh Gandhi said that the government officers are spending only 4.6% of their time on RTI whereas the Hon. Supreme Court has said almost 75% of the time is spent by Government officers on RTI.
